Adult Education Student Exit Survey Results: 2016-17 & 2017-18

Results for MSJC San Jacinto Campus

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Overview

The Southwest Riverside Consortium's Adult Education Surveys were developed to capture students' points of view regarding current adult education services, challenges, delivery modalities, as well as input for future consideration. Two surveys, an Entrance (also for currently enrolled students) and Exit, were designed. The results that follow are based on Exit surveys completed in the 2016-17 and 2017-18 school years. Participants by member site are presented below:

A total of 1,931 Exit student surveys were collected consortium-wide for the 2017-18 school year.
