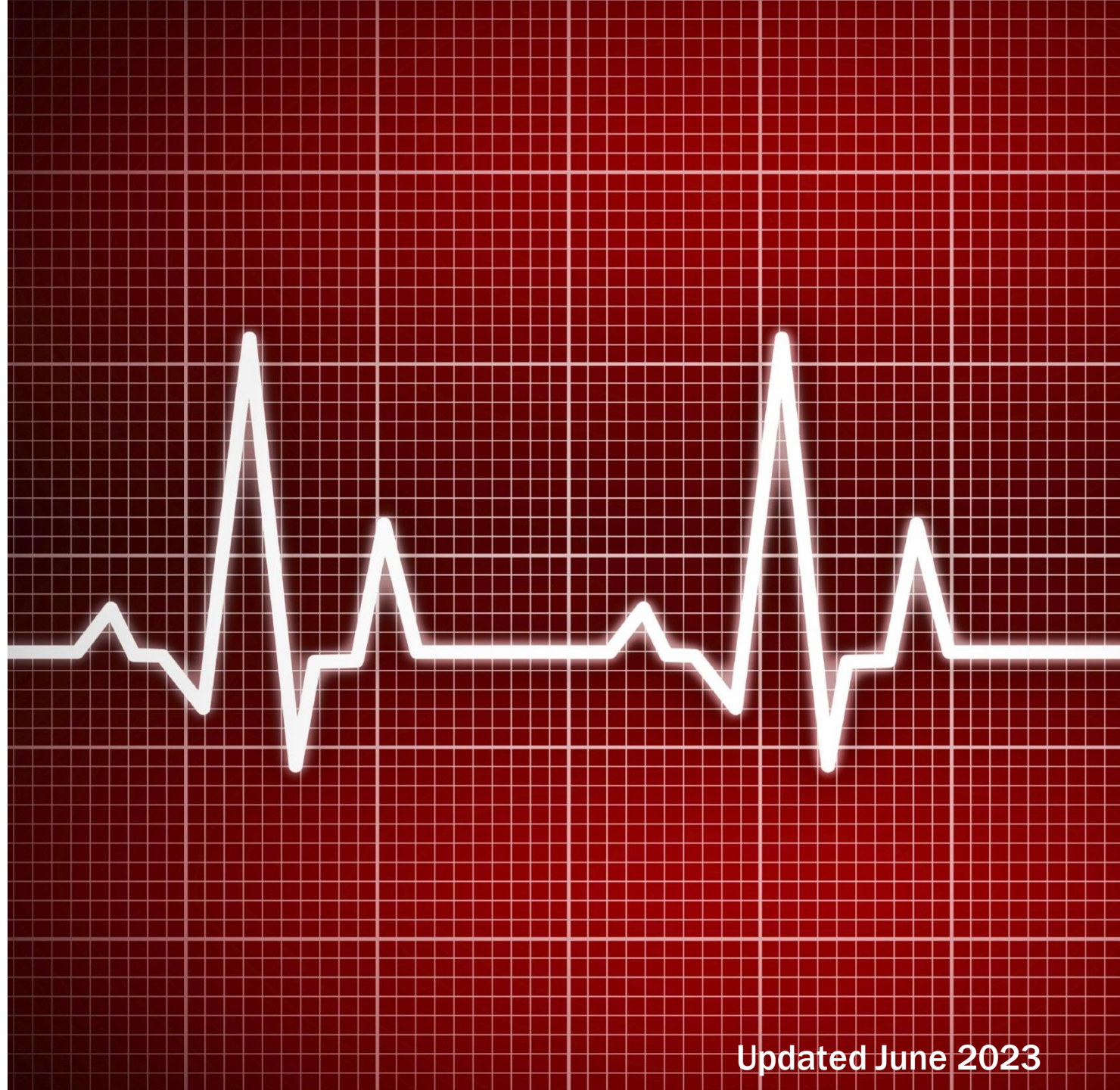

ADN APPLICATION PROCESS

PRIOR TO BEING ACCEPTED INTO THE NURSING PROGRAM YOU MUST COMPLETE STEPS **1-7** BEFORE SUBMITTING AN APPLICATION TO THE NURSING DEPARTMENT

1. Submit a GENERAL Admission application to MSJC.
2. Complete a School of Nursing & Allied Health Evaluation Request Form.
 - After student completes/is in final semester of completing program prerequisites, meet with a Counselor to sign & date the Nursing & Allied Health Evaluation Request Form.
 - Submit Evaluation Request Form to Enrollment Services

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3. After submitting Evaluation Request Form, student will receive an eligibility letter (Program Notes) from the Evaluator. Eligibility letter must be attached to Nursing application (**please note, Evaluation Request Form is NOT the application.**)
4. After student applies to program between the filing periods, student will receive notification of acceptance or denial through the email listed on their application, one or two months after applying.
5. Submit a Nursing Application and all supporting documentation, to the NAHD office between:

APPLICATION PROCESS (Cont'd)

Applications must be received in the NAHD office no later than 11:59 pm on the deadline date. No applications will be accepted after the 15th. Applications **MUST** be complete at the time of submission, or will not be considered for admission. No further paperwork will be accepted once applications are submitted. **NO EXCEPTIONS.**

Documents to be submitted with application must include, but are not limited to:

- Copies of Letter of Eligibility and pre-requisite evaluation results aka “Program Notes”
- High School Graduation verification (copy of diploma or GED if stated on Program Notes)
- Copy of previous Academic Degrees, Diplomas, or relevant Certificates
- Grade point average in prerequisite courses
- Life experiences
- Military
- Proficiency or advanced level coursework in a language other than English
- Relevant work or volunteer in health care in the last 3 years
- Copy of unofficial TEAS full report including component sections of English, math, science, and reading (Official results will be requested upon acceptance)
- Work or Volunteer Experience form (Signed & Dated by Employer or Supervisor with contact information) 100 hours or more, can be used for criteria 4 and/or 7 on Multi-criteria point system.

Documents to be attached to the Evaluation Request Form:

- Students who completed courses outside of MSJC, will need to provide official transcripts from all previous colleges and/or universities.
- If student is taking courses outside MSJC during the Evaluation submission period, student is to attach unofficial transcripts with Evaluation form showing courses are "In-progress." Student will submit official transcripts immediately after course completion for Evaluation to be processed and to receive eligibility to apply to program.
- If ordering official transcripts, you must provide proof transcripts have been requested and attach proof to Evaluation form.
- Students completing all coursework at Mt. San Jacinto College will only need to submit the Evaluation Request Form.
- Student will receive a written "Eligibility Email" from the Evaluator through their MSJC student email, this notification is to be attached to the application during the application filing period along with "program notes". The link to student's program notes will be included in the Eligibility Email.
- If student does not provide an eligibility email and program notes with application, student's application will be disqualified.

- If applying for graduation during the Spring or Fall semester, it is stated in the comments.

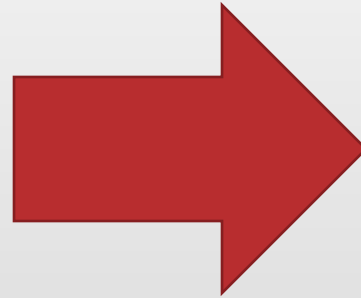

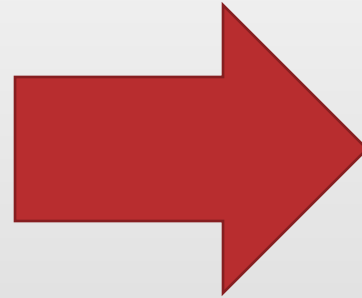

TEST OF ESSENTIAL ACADEMIC SKILLS (TEAS)

- Prospective nursing students must pass a **Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS)** prior to program admission.

TEAS Subject Areas (**Math/English/Reading/Science**) (Version 7)

- Prospective nursing students must take the Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS) at a designated testing center. Official ATI scores must be submitted to MSJC ADN Program through ATI. Prospective Nursing Students must achieve a passing composite score of 62% to be eligible to apply.
- Students are required to submit their highest TEAS scores, therefore preparation for this assessment is essential.

CRIMINAL BACKGROUND CHECK

Students must have a clear criminal background check to participate in clinical(s) at the hospital facilities. The background check is not a requirement for admission to an academic program and will be completed after a student is admitted. Background checks are required for registration in hospital clinical courses or hospital observation. The initial background check satisfies this requirement during continuous enrollment in the program; should the educational process be interrupted, a new background check will be required.

Background checks will minimally include the following:

- Seven years history
- Address verification
- Sex offender database search
- Two names (current legal and one other name)
- Seven counties
- Department of Justice Office of Inspector General (OIG) search
- Social Security Number verification

Students may be denied access to clinical facilities based on offenses appearing on the criminal record, even if they occurred more than seven years ago.

ESTIMATED PROGRAM COSTS

1. Students pay for tuition, ASB card, student health fee, parking permit, as stated in the current college catalog.
2. Nursing uniforms designated by the Nursing Department - \$350
3. Nursing textbooks and supplies - \$2,500 for the entire program
4. CPR courses - \$65
5. Physical examinations/laboratory tests - \$300-\$500
6. Medical Document / Background Package - CastleBranch
(includes background check, drug screen & medical document manager) - \$121.75
7. CastleBranch random drug screen - \$32
8. Licensing Board applications - Approximately \$300-\$400
9. Kaplan Testing - \$600-\$750
10. Student Supply Kits - \$200
11. Professional Student Nursing Insurance coverage is required and is purchased through Nurse Services Organization (NSO). Additional liability insurance covering students is provided by the college at no cost to the student. - \$35/year
12. Personal Health Insurance coverage - vendor costs may vary
13. Fingerprinting (Mental Health) - \$60-70
