A MESSAGE FROM THE

COLLEGE SUPERINTENDENT/PRESIDENT

The students who graduated in May of 2022 spent most of their educational journey at Mt. San Jacinto College on Zoom because of the COVID-19 pandemic years. That didn't stop them from achieving their goals. And it didn't stop our dedicated faculty, classified professionals, supervisors and administrators from making extraordinary efforts to help our students succeed.

In this report, you'll read about other accomplishments we shared with our communities in 2021-22. We held grand openings and groundbreakings at the San Jacinto and Menifee Valley Campuses. We welcomed the first students to our Temecula Valley Campus. We entered into an agreement with Beaumont Unified School District to create a middle college high school at our San Gorgonio Pass Campus.

We continued to make progress in Diversity, Equity, Inclusion and Access initiatives to ensure we work to dismantle systemic racism and reduce opportunity gaps for our African American and Black students and other marginalized populations at MSJC. We also take pride in the many programs and events hosted by MSJC students, faculty and staff that celebrate the diversity of our students and offer enrichment to our communities.

I want to close this message by looking to the future, but to do that, I have to go back to the past. In March 1962, the very first MSJC Board of Trustees held their initial meeting.

To honor that historic occasion, our Board of Trustees celebrated 60 years at the March 2022 board meeting.

We owe much thanks to those early visionaries. They were the leaders who opened doors to students in the fall of 1963. So, as we enter 2023, you'll be hearing more about MSJC's 60th anniversary that will kick off in the fall.

We will have much to celebrate during this anniversary. We will have more grand openings, among them the new stadium at the Kinesiology and Athletics Complex at the Menifee Valley Campus and our new state-of-the-art Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM) building at the San Jacinto Campus. We will have more celebrations highlighting the diversity of our students and the communities we serve. You will hear more from our MSJC Foundation and learn about the ways we can support and advocate for our students.

ABOUT MSJC

The Mt. San Jacinto Community College District was formed in 1960 by a vote of the citizens in Banning, Beaumont, Hemet and San Jacinto. The first students attended MSJC in Fall 1963. The San Jacinto Campus opened on former farmland in 1965. The Temecula, Lake Elsinore, Perris and adjacent areas voted in 1975 to join the district, increasing the college's area to the present 1,700 square miles. MSJC serves students on four sites in Menifee, San Jacinto, Temecula and the San Gorgonio Pass.

MSJC Celebrates 60th Birthday of its Board of Trustees

The first Mt. San Jacinto Community College District Board of Trustees held an inaugural College Board meeting on March 14, 1962, at Security Bank in Hemet. The meeting was called to order by Dr. Leonard Grindstaff, who was the Riverside County Superintendent of Schools.

The MSJC Foundation's mission is to enhance the quality of District initiatives and programs by securing public and private funding to reduce barriers.




BUILDING STEM

Groundbreaking ceremonies were held for the Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM) buildings at the San Jacinto and Menifee Valley campuses in spring 2022.

The \$39 million, three-story STEM building in San Jacinto is expected to open in the 2023-2024 academic year. The \$49.7 million STEM building in Menifee will follow shortly after. MSJC's voter-approved Measure AA facilities bond will fund half of the projects while the state's Prop. 51 will fund the other half. Voters passed the district's Measure AA, a \$295 million facilities bond, in 2014.









ANIMAKERSPACE

The college celebrated the new Animatronic Makerspace at the San Jacinto Campus in March. Redlands visionary Garner Holt Education Through Imagination (GHETI) built the two-room AniMakerspace in the 100 Building. The project was funded by the California Strong Workforce Program, a state initiative aimed at developing more workforce opportunities and lifting low-wage workers into living-wage jobs through Career Education.

TEMECULA VALLEY CAMPUS WELCOMES FIRST STUDENTS

The Fall 2021 semester launched Aug. 16 with the eagerly awaited Temecula Valley Campus welcoming students for the first time. "It's absolutely beautiful. It's honestly breathtaking," said student Castin Chamberlain, who served as the college's student trustee in spring 2021.

MSJC TEAMS WITH BEAUMONT UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT

MSJC and the Beaumont Unified School District in January announced a partnership to launch Beaumont Middle College High School (BMCHS) at the San Gorgonio Pass Campus in Banning. The program will allow students to begin college-level coursework as they are finishing high school and prepare for either a four-year institution or receive their associate degree and enter the workforce.

COLLEGE RANKS ON HISPANIC OUTLOOK MAGAZINE'S TOP 25 LIST

Hispanic Outlook on Education magazine ranked MSJC as one of its Top 25 Community Colleges in the nation for Hispanics. The national publication ranked the college 18th in degrees awarded to Hispanics. Last year, MSJC ranked 24th. Latinx students earned about 53 percent of all MSJC degrees.

COLLEGE RECEIVES \$2.8 MILLION HSI GRANT

The U.S. Department of Education awarded MSJC a \$2.8 million Title V Hispanic-Serving Institution (HSI) Grant in September. The five-year grant is designed to provide students with access to more programs that will help them stay in college, succeed, and improve graduation and transfer rates.





MSJC PARTNERS WITH UNIVERSITY OF MICHIGAN TO SUPPORT VETERANS

MSJC and the University of Michigan have teamed up to help incoming veteran and military students. Michigan's Peer Advisors for Veteran Education (PAVE) program trains student-veterans at MSJC to help mentor incoming MSJC student-veterans.

NURSING PROGRAM NAMED #1 IN THE INLAND EMPIRE

MSJC's Nursing Program earned the top spot in the Community College/Nursing category in the Press-Enterprise's 26th annual Best of the Inland Empire readers' choice awards. "We appreciate the readers' recognition of our stellar nursing program," said Joyce Johnson, Provost of MSJC's Temecula Valley Campus and a registered nurse (currently serving as Vice President of Career Education, Counseling, Nursing, and Allied Health). "We're very proud of our nursing graduates who consistently pass the licensing exam and secure jobs in the field. It's a testament to our dedicated faculty and classified professionals."

MSJC LAUNCHES NEW PROGRAMS TO PREPARE STUDENTS FOR IN-DEMAND CAREERS

The college launched four new and updated Career Education programs in the fall designed to prepare students for in-demand jobs and careers in Aviation Science, Culinary Arts, Engineering, and Geospatial Information Science.

COLLEGE SELECTED TO PARTICIPATE IN URBAN INSTITUTE'S CTE COLAB

MSJC was among 12 colleges nationwide to be selected by the Urban Institute's Career and Technical Education (CTE) CoLab to participate in its College Community of Practice. MSJC's two-year participation focuses on its Water Technology program. The CoLab aims to reduce inequities in academic and career outcomes for students of color — especially students who are Black, Latinx or Indigenous — enrolled in online postsecondary Career Education programs.

NEW ONLINE JOB BOARD HELPS STUDENTS, EMPLOYERS

MSJC launched a new online job board to better serve its students and employers in the region at a time when companies are struggling to fill a myriad of vacant positions. Jobspeaker.com provides a skills-based platform that enables regional employers to post their positions that students can then view through a well-organized job search.

MSJC RECEIVES STATE APPRENTICESHIP GRANT

MSJC received a \$500,000 grant from the California Apprenticeship Initiative (CAI) for a new Automotive and Transportation Technologies Apprenticeship. The grant program was created to increase the middle-skilled labor workforce in California in nontraditional and innovative sectors.






BUSINESS MAJOR EARNS 2022 JACK KENT COOKE SCHOLARSHIP

MSJC business major Enrique Baranda earned a prestigious 2022 Cooke Undergraduate Transfer Scholarship from the Jack Kent Cooke Foundation.

The Hemet resident has served as the Regional Southeast District Vice President for the Nevada/California Region of Phi Theta Kappa (PTK). Baranda, a first-generation college student, also received the PTK Distinguished Chapter Officer Award.

Baranda is one of only 100 high-achieving community college students nationwide to receive the highly competitive scholarship, which provides students with up to \$55,000 a year to complete their bachelor's degrees. He plans to attend UC Riverside.



FIVE MSJC STUDENTS EARN PRESTIGIOUS RECOGNITION FOR ACADEMICS

Five MSJC students earned spots on the prestigious 2022 Phi Theta-Kappa (PTK) All-California Academic Team. The Community College League of California only chose 114 students from across the 116 California Community Colleges to rank on the first, second and third academic teams.

MSJC's Breeanna Fleener and Amy Westen earned First Team honors; Christian Menera achieved Second Team honors; and Maribel Avila Flores and Irma Cruz-Dogan attained Third Team honors.



COMPUTER SCIENCE MAJOR CHOSEN TO ATTEND NASA PROGRAM

Manuel Marquez, a computer science major, was selected to attend NASA Community College Aerospace Scholars (NCAS) program. The Hemet resident & Army veteran was part of a team that put together a mock mission to Mars during the 5-day program.



MSJC CELEBRATES RECORD-BREAKING CLASS WITH IN-PERSON GRADUATION

MSJC CELEBRATED A RECORD-BREAKING 2,226 GRADUATES ON THURSDAY, MAY 26, DURING TWO GRADUATION CEREMONIES AT PECHANGA RESORT CASINO IN TEMECULA.

They earned a total of 2,717 associate degrees and 502 certificates, as some students earn more than one degree, certificate, or a combination. This year's theme was "Eagles: Unstoppable Today, Tomorrow, and Always."

INAUGURAL FALL CEREMONY RECOGNIZES GRADUATES & TRANSFER STUDENTS

Yesenia Carrillo was among about 200 Mt. San Jacinto College students who participated in the college district's first Fall Graduation & Transfer Drive-Through Celebration at its San Jacinto Campus on Dec. 17.

MSJC celebrated 36 Adult Education students in May for earning their GED at the college this year. Many of the students planned to transition into career certificate or associate degree programs at the college.




MSJC HOLDS ANNUAL EOPS RECOGNITION CEREMONY


PERFORMING ARTS AND DANCE DEPARTMENT PRESENTS HYBRID 'EVOKE'

appearance was their second in a row and
third in Head Coach Casey Mazzotta's 14-year
tenure. MSJC's Sherod White earned Offensive
Player of the Year honors while 10 of his

Mazzotta was named Co-Coach of the Year in the American Division.

teammates were named First Team All-Conference.







Beach volleyball was introduced as a CCCAA-sanctioned sport in spring 2022 for MSJC as the team competed in 20 matches throughout the season. A roster of 13 student-athletes made up the inaugural Eagle team. MSJC played their home matches on their new courts at the Menifee Valley Campus and are looking forward to continuing to build the new program. Luci Villafana and Alicia Vasquez earned First Team All-Conference honors for the Eagles who finished their first season with a fourth-place finish in the Pacific Coast Athletic Conference.

The MSJC volleyball team won their second straight conference title by going undefeated in the Inland Empire Athletic Conference. The team also made their fourth playoff appearance in the past five seasons. The past two conference titles are the only ones in program history. MSJC finished the season with a 17-6 record. Ruby Ruiz was named the Inland Empire Athletic Conference (IEAC) Player of the Year, and Head Coach Serinna Eason earned IEAC Coach of the Year honors.



MSJC men's basketball coach Patrick Springer stepped down as the leader of the Eagles at the conclusion of the 2021-22 season. Springer took over the MSJC program in 2003. His Eagle teams went 359-165 during his time as the head coach, and in his career, Springer totaled 429 wins in 21 seasons. In his final season, he led MSJC to the playoffs for the 13th straight year as they finished the season with an 18-11 record. Anton Mozga and Isaiah Skinner earned First Team All-Conference honors for the Eagles.



The MSJC women's basketball team won their fourth straight conference championship in 2022 and reached the CCCAA State playoffs for the 15th straight season. The conference title was the program's seventh in the past nine years. The Eagles finished the season with an overall record of 22-6, it was also their 15th straight season with 20 or more wins. Deja Blue earned Inland Empire Athletic Conference (IEAC) Player of the Year honors as well as being named First Team All-State. Head Coach Chris Mozga earned his 500th career victory as a college coach.

"Through the trials of 2020, our community truly showed remarkable resilience," said MSJC Theater Chair Bianca Swan Finch, the lead organizer of the event.




General Fund Unrestricted Revenues and Beginning Fund Balance:

General Fund Unrestricted Expenditures and Ending Fund Balance:




Foundation Fund Revenues and Beginning Fund Balance:
