We've reached a milestone, celebrating 60 years of service to our communities. We've witnessed incredible growth, transformation of our campuses and programs, and a renewed sense of purpose that will continue MSJC's Legacy of Transformation by taking our college district into a bright future.

The achievements of our college district have been enhanced and supported by the initiatives of our MSJC Foundation, which has refined its efforts to focus on sponsorships and naming rights agreements that will secure funding to help students and the college district well into the future.

I am thrilled to announce that the Foundation's new efforts have already resulted in a historic, first-time naming rights agreement. Our new stadium at the Menifee Valley Campus now bears the name "HCN Bank Stadium." Thanks to HCN Bank, formerly The Bank of Hemet, the \$1 million, 10-year agreement represents a deep trust in MSJC and significant investment in our students and our communities.

We are honored that HCN Bank holds such trust in MSJC to continue its Legacy of Transformation. The fact that this legacy continues is evidenced by several data points, which include, but are not limited to, MSJC serving as an economic engine, generating more than \$500 million a year for this region; serving 25,400 students annually; accommodating increased enrollments that exceed pre-pandemic numbers during a time when our peers across the state were struggling with low enrollments; and supporting student success and completion, the most recent of which are the 1,978 graduates in the Class of 2023.

You don't need numbers to tell you about our Legacy of Transformation. You can see the evidence everywhere you look. MSJC alumni are serving on city councils, school boards, as school district principals and superintendents, as teachers, nurses, emergency personnel, and owners of businesses. Supported by outstanding faculty with real-world experience, dedicated classified professionals and administrators, and our Board of Trustees, who are committed to upholding our mission and vision, our students transform at MSJC and then carry the MSJC legacy into the future. The complex was the first building fully constructed from the ground up that was funded by Measure AA. FOUNDATION: HISTORIC STADIUM NAMING RIGHTS SPONSORSHIP

The college district and MSJC Foundation joined with HCN Bank (formerly called The Bank of Hemet) to announce a historic \$1 million naming rights and sponsorship agreement that names MSJC's new stadium at its Menifee Valley Campus "HCN Bank Stadium."

The naming rights and sponsorship agreement is the largest and the first of its kind in MSJC history. The 10-year agreement builds upon a decades-long relationship between the MSJC and HCN Bank, which has continually supported students, scholarships, and activities at MSJC.

The HCN Bank stadium is game changer for the region. It will serve as a hub for a wide range of athletic events, community gatherings, concerts, and student engagement activities.

- **Seats up to 5,000 people**
- **Stadium can accommodate 20,000 people.**

It is managed by community leaders who volunteer to work with college staff to meet the needs of this college district. As a nonprofit, 501(c)3, we have provided more than \$3.5 million in scholarships and other support over the last 40 years. We've provided mini grants to students and faculty and offered assistance through programs like the Pledge for Success, made possible through funds raised from the private and public sectors.

Four years ago, we understood it was time to redefine how we can better serve this district. We decided to move from solely a scholarship-granting auxiliary to one that leverages its alumni base and its relationships with the community to secure a strong financial future through development and other fundraising opportunities. We understand that MSJC students and the district will need continued support to fill in the gaps when unforeseen circumstances arise.

In this annual report you will learn how the Foundation supports college events, fosters community partnerships and helps students reach their goals. You'll also learn more about opportunities to show your support.

We are so pleased that HCN Bank and the Riverside County Board of Supervisors have made their historic investments in this college district. 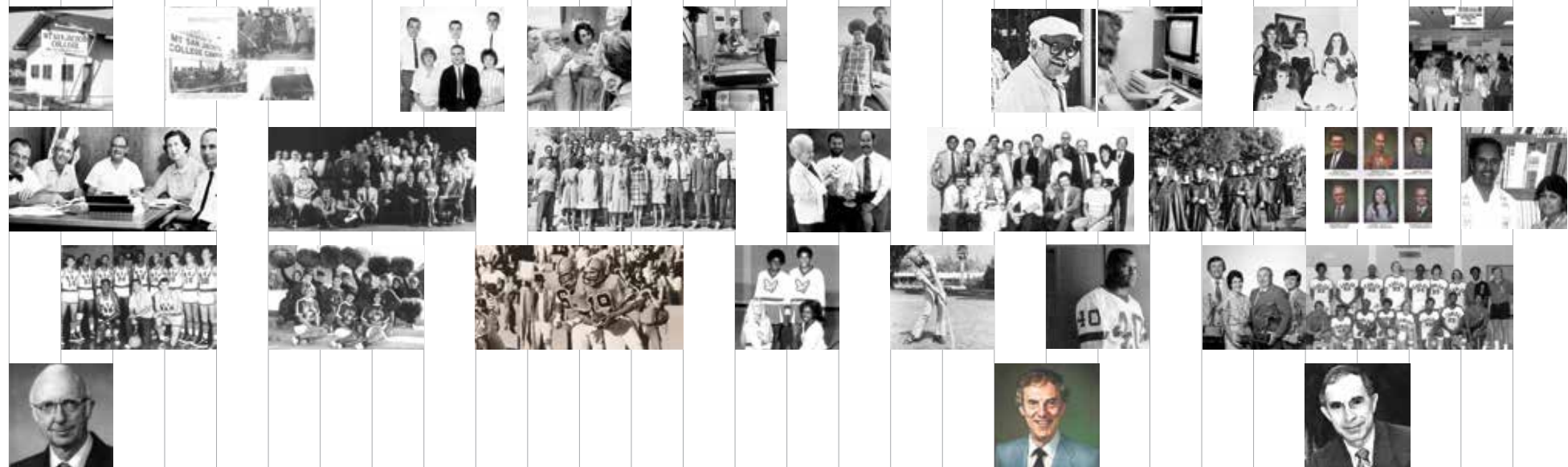

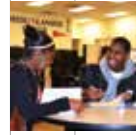

ANN MOTTE: A LIFETIME OF SERVICE

In 2022, Trustee Ann Motte chose to step down from her seat after serving the fast-growing district for three decades as an advocate for expanded access and increasing the college-going rate of Southwestern Riverside County residents.

Her efforts are deserving of a lifetime achievement award. Motte was the district's longest-serving trustee, has served as a director for the Perris Historical Society, was named Woman of the Year by former California Assemblyman Ray Haynes, and pushed for partnerships with local business, industry, cities, and communities to increase experiential opportunities for students to explore and pursue as part of a larger effort to strengthen the regional workforce.

At a December 8, 2022, dedication of the Temecula Valley Campus, Motte was praised for her service by many, including Menifee Mayor and former MSJC District Trustee Bill Zimmerman and MSJC President/Superintendent Roger Schultz, Ph.D.

Motte did not seek reelection in the 2022 election. Her vacated seat was filled by Jhalister Corona, who was sworn in at the December 15, 2022, board meeting. A resident of Perris, Motte attended Colorado State University as a business administration major and has worked with her husband, John Motte, in commercial investment real estate.

JOSHUA RIVERA: ONCE AN EAGLE, ALWAYS AN EAGLE

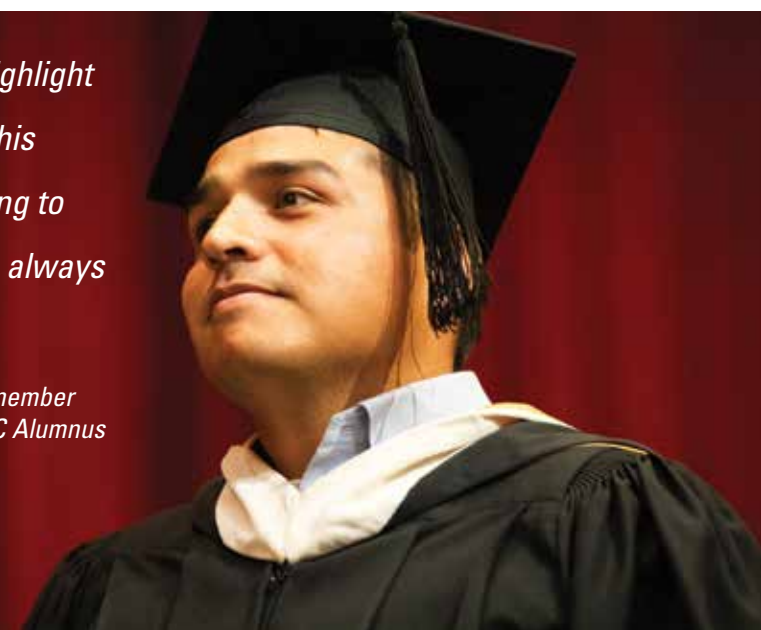

MSJC'S STATE OF THE COLLEGE A SUCCESS

Community leaders, donors, alumni, and guests gathered at the annual State of the College at the Menifee Valley Campus to reflect on the college's accomplishments over the past three years and learn about its plans for the future.

The event highlighted the college's achievements, including record enrollment, amplified diversity efforts, addition of new programs, improved workforce training, enhanced partnerships, and incredible facilities improvements.

ACHIEVEMENTS

MSJC RECOGNIZED FOR EQUITY ACHIEVEMENTS

MSJC earned recognition from The Campaign for College Opportunity for excelling in equitable course placement for Black and African American students.

MSJC, one of 55 community colleges to receive one of the awards from The Campaign for College Opportunity, earned recognition for its Equity Designation for Black Transfer-Level English Enrollment. Colleges earning this distinction are recognized for supporting 100% of Black students to enroll directly into transfer-level English.

"The success of our Black and African American students is a priority," said Roger Schultz, Ph.D., Superintendent/President. "Starting in 2019, MSJC became a leader in the state with its Equity Pledge, and soon after a Call to Action. Diversity, equity, inclusion, and accessibility (DEIA) are a guiding principle at our institution and this recognition is a testament to our commitment to reduce barriers caused by systemic racism."

State Senator Rosilicie Ochoa Bogh recognized MSJC for its 2023 Champion for Excelling in Equitable Course Placement in Black English Enrollment award during the November Board of Trustees meeting.



MSJC VOTED #1 IN 2023

Readers of The Press-Enterprise have consistently voted MSJC as the favorite community college in Best of the Inland Empire Awards for more than a decade.

MSJC HEALTHCARE PROGRAMS EXPANDING

MSJC is addressing the critical shortage of healthcare workers. MSJC is expanding emergency medical technician offerings and launching a paramedic program, among other programs to train qualified healthcare workers.

MSJC has a proud history of success with its allied health programs. Graduates of the Associate Degree Nursing program who participated in the occupational internship program have secured employment, many in the local region.

Obtaining a job in the field of study is one of the reasons MSJC's Allied Health and Nursing Program earns high recognition in the industry.

The college's Nursing Program was named No. 1 in the two-county Inland Empire by readers of The Press-Enterprise in the "Best of the Inland Empire" awards in 2022.



MSJC AWARDED DIVERSITY GRANTS TO SUPPORT NATIVE AMERICAN STUDENTS

Mt. San Jacinto College secured two significant grants from the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office aimed at bolstering student success: a \$600,000 Native American Student Support and Success Program award and a \$297,170 Culturally Responsive Pedagogy & Practices award. The \$600,000 grant is aimed at eliminating equity gaps and developing Native American leaders. The \$297,170 grant will help grow DEIA-minded and culturally competent professional development training for faculty.



FOUNDATION: WINTER WONDERLAND GRANTS CHRISTMAS WISHES

The MSJC Foundation and the MSJC Phi Theta Kappa Honor Society organized the Winter Wonderland Fall Unity Celebration to grant Christmas wishes to over 50 families of MSJC students.

The event was sponsored by the generous donations of the Soboba Band of Luiseño Indians Foundation and the Mexico Café in Temecula. The Unity Celebration invited 50 families and additional student families from affinity groups to enjoy a night full of hot chocolate and desserts while getting toys for their children.

With the donations, MSJC student families were able to give their children the presents they wanted most this holiday season.

MENIFEE VALLEY CHAMBER HONORS MSJC

The Menifee Valley Chamber named MSJC the 2023 Large Business of the Year.

"This is such an honor to receive this award from our Chamber. We know MSJC is among a list of distinguished businesses in this community," Vicki Carpenter, who represents Menifee as a trustee on the MSJC Board of Trustees, said.

Roger Schultz, Ph.D., Superintendent/President, said he is proud of the collaboration the college district has with the city, school district, and businesses in the community.

"We love this community. We've grown with this community and great things are still to come," Schultz said. "We are thrilled to receive this award from the Menifee Valley Chamber."

LEAH DI BERNARDO: CULINARY PIONEER

Innovative college instructor? Check. Respected restaurateur? Check. Temecula Citizen of the Year? Check.

Di Bernardo, MSJC Culinary Arts instructor and founder and chef of Extraordinary Artisan Table, or EAT Marketplace, in Temecula was named Citizen of the Year by the Temecula Valley Chamber of Commerce. Di Bernardo is also a key member of an advisory group aiming to meld culinary arts, business, and environmental science into a new, interdisciplinary Regenerative Agriculture Program at the college.



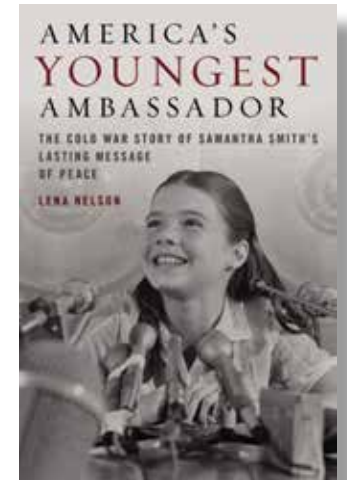

FACULTY ACHIEVEMENTS: RECAPTURING HISTORY

Mt. San Jacinto College ESL instructor Lena Nelson is now a published author.

Nelson's compelling new book, *America's Youngest Ambassador: The Cold War Story of Samantha Smith's Lasting Message of Peace*, details the life of Samantha Smith. As a 10-year-old in 1982, she melted hearts across the globe when she wrote Cold War Soviet leader Yuri Andropov to ask if he was really going to wage a nuclear war against America. When Pravda, the largest Soviet newspaper, published Samantha's letter and she received an unprecedented invitation from Andropov to visit the Soviet Union, she and her family embarked on a historic journey that helped transform the trajectory of two nations on a collision course toward catastrophe.



The book culminates Nelson's 17 years of researching and documenting Samantha's story and creating an online archive of news articles and videos of the young girl's life. The author juxtaposes Samantha's narrative with that of her own childhood in the Soviet Union in the 1980s, delving into the consequences of government propaganda on both sides of the ocean.

Samantha, who was from Manchester, Maine, died at age 13 when the plane in which she was flying crashed on a rainy August night while approaching an airport in Auburn, Maine. Nelson, a one-time nominee for the Allegra Johnson Prize in Memoir Writing, has degrees in international studies and linguistics and has been teaching at MSJC since 2017. The book is a testament to her passion and intellectual rigor.



TOM DONOVAN PROVIDES “FREUD FOR THOUGHT”

Is indulging the “child within” with fame or fortune the path to happiness and a meaningful life? In his book “Freud for Thought: On Forging the Philosophical Life,” Thomas Donovan, Ph.D., chair of Philosophy at MSJC, suggests there’s a better way. Donovan asserts that Freud’s “Civilization and its Discontents,” first published in 1930, is still relevant today.



Using Freud’s work as a foundation, Donovan’s book urges readers to resist the temptations of celebrity culture, materialism and the pursuit of power and success by reining in childlike instincts through a mature process of “deep reflection, conversation, and noble practices” to find the true path to happiness. This is Donovan’s third book. His other books are “The Dialectic of Enlightenment as Sport” and “The False Dialectic Between Christians and Atheists.” An associate professor at MSJC for 15 years, Donovan teaches online and in person classes in Philosophy and Critical Thinking.

VICE PRESIDENT JOYCE JOHNSON APPOINTED TO NATIONAL COUNCIL FOR WORKFORCE EDUCATION BOARD

Joyce Johnson, Vice President of Career Education, Counseling, Nursing, and Allied Health, was appointed to serve on the board of directors of the National Council on Workforce Education (NCWE). This appointment is a testament to Johnson’s experience and expertise of career education and workforce development programs.



By serving on the NCWE, Johnson will help shape workforce policies and initiatives at a national level. She is one of only two leaders on the board of directors representing California community colleges.

REBECCA TEAGUE NAMED VP STUDENT SERVICES



Rebecca Teague was named MSJC’s new Vice President of Student Services. Teague has nearly two decades of experience in community college higher education. Since coming to MSJC in 2004, Teague has served in many roles, including interim VP Student Services, grant writer, and she spearheaded the District’s Student Equity Pledge and other diversity, equity, inclusion, and accessibility initiatives. She is the first Latinx female to serve as Vice President of Student Services in MSJC history.

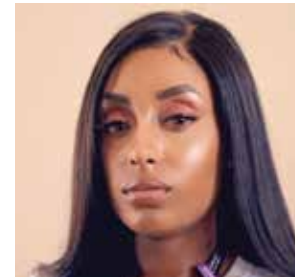

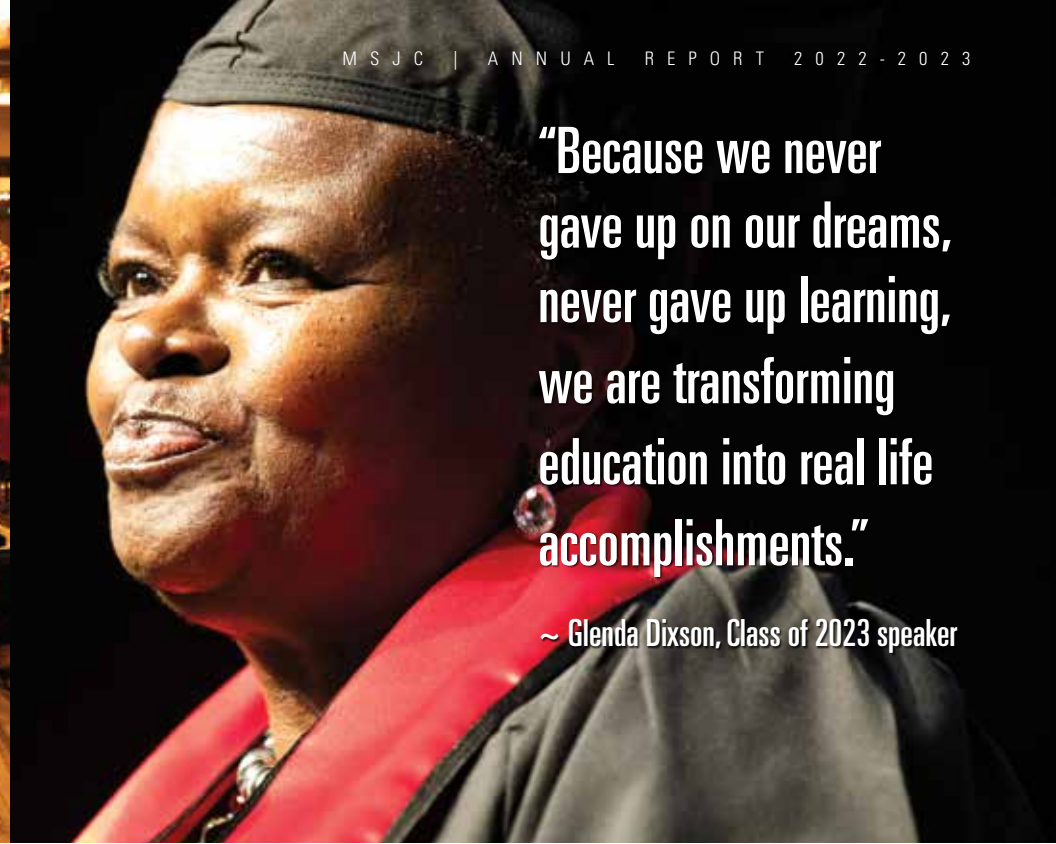

MSJC CELEBRATES THE ACHIEVEMENTS OF THE CLASS OF 2023

MSJC awarded 2,747 degrees and certificates to 1,978 students in the Class of 2023. The graduates earned a total of 2,383 associate degrees and 364 certificates, as some students earn more than one degree, certificate, or a combination.

Mt. San Jacinto College Athletics teams shined over the past year, with the MSJC women's basketball team going undefeated in the conference season en route to a fifth straight conference title and 16th straight state playoffs appearance, while the MSJC Eagles football team went undefeated in league play en route to claiming its second straight American Mountain Conference championship in 2022. Women's basketball head coach Chris Mozga retired at the end of the season with 10 conference championships and one state title at the helm for the Eagles. Guard Sandee Heiermann was named Inland Empire Athletics Conference Player of the Year as well as earning First Team All-State honors. Eagles quarterback Robert Coleman was named the division's Offensive Player of the Year and Coach Casey Mazzotta earned Co-Conference Coach of the Year honors.

MSJC ATHLETICS TOP 5 STORIES OF 2022-23 ACADEMIC YEAR



The **MSJC women's soccer team** qualified for the CCCAA state playoffs for the first time since 2016. The Eagles finished in third place in the Inland Empire Athletic Conference and ended the season with an overall record of 10-8-1. Riley Marshall, Aaliyah Sims, Karyme Mendoza, and Alexis Salgado all earned First Team All-IEAC honors, and four additional Eagles were named second team all-conference.



The **MSJC baseball team** made their first postseason appearance since 2016 and finished runners-up in the Inland Empire Athletic Conference standings. The Eagles ended the season with an impressive record of 29-12 overall and 16-8 in the Inland Empire Athletics Conference. Pitchers Nolan LaChappa and Garrett Teunissen were named First Team All-League, and the team was awarded the 14 seed in the So Cal Regional playoffs.



The **MSJC women's basketball team** won its fifth consecutive conference title as the squad went undefeated with a 14-0 record in league games. The Eagles also reached the state playoffs for the 16th straight year and concluded the season with an overall record of 27-3. Head Coach Chris Mozga retired at the end of the season with 10 conference championships and one state title at the helm for the Eagles. Taylor Bell has taken over the program. Sandee Heiermann, guard, was named Inland Empire Athletics Conference Player of the Year as well as earning First Team All-State honors.



The **MSJC Eagles football team** claimed their second straight conference championship, winning the American Mountain Conference title in 2022. The Eagles appeared in a Bowl game for their third consecutive season and played in the American Division Championship game for the second straight year. The Eagles were unbeaten in conference games at 5-0 and finished the season 9-2 overall. Quarterback Robert Coleman was named the Offensive Player of the Year in the Division and Coach Casey Mazzotta earned Co-Conference Coach of the Year honors.



The **Eagle Athletic Department** set a record for impressive graduation rates in 2022-23 as 85% of the sophomores listed on rosters throughout the program's 12 sports earned an associate degree. Sixty-five student-athletes in all earned degrees with most transferring to four-year universities to continue their education and playing careers.

The event, hosted by the MSJC Foundation, was held at the newly named HCN Bank Stadium at the Menifee Valley Campus, and sponsored by Balfour Beatty and Blue Violet Networking.

Inductees to the MSJC Department of Athletics' Hall of Fame:

Jamaal Tinsley, who led the Eagles to the state championship game during his sophomore season in 1999. He went on to play in the NBA for the Indiana Pacers, Memphis Grizzlies, LA D-Fenders, and Utah Jazz.

The 1999 MSJC Football Team, which finished the season 10-1 overall, were the undefeated champions of the Foothill Conference, and ranked #8 in the country.

John Norman, an All-Conference and All-State quarterback for MSJC who led the team to a conference championship in 1975. Norman later taught and coached at MSJC, serves on the Board of Trustees for the San Jacinto Unified School District, and has served his community in many roles.

Ken Reed has served MSJC's Athletics Department for 50 years. He was a baseball player at MSJC, assisted with score keeping and served as announcer, helped raise funds for the department and continues to be heavily involved in his community.

The MSJC Foundation honorees:

Don Domenigoni is an MSJC alumnus and served as Alumni President. Since 1993, he has served on the MSJC Foundation board in many roles, including as the board's President.

HCN Bank and CEO Kevin Farrenkopf for their generous support dating back three decades. Under Farrenkopf's leadership, HCN Bank became the first organization to commit to a \$1 million naming rights agreement to name the new stadium at the Menifee Valley Campus the HCN Bank Stadium.

TEMECULA VALLEY CAMPUS DEDICATED

MSJC's newest campus, a 350,000-square-foot modern structure in the heart of Temecula, has been officially dedicated. The Temecula Valley Campus now stands as the first permanent higher education campus in Southwest Riverside County. This new facility supports the growing need for quality higher education in the region.

Doors to the Temecula Valley Campus opened to students for the 2021-2022 academic year. An official dedication ceremony was held on December 8, 2022.

MSJC secured funding from voter-approved Measure AA for the \$56.5 million project, saving taxpayer dollars by purchasing the facility instead of embarking on the time-consuming and costly process of constructing a new campus. Formerly owned by Abbott Laboratories, the five-story building on Motor Car Parkway was re-purposed by C.W. Driver Companies, which completed a seismic retrofit and transformed former offices into classrooms to meet student needs.

Classrooms and laboratories with state-of-the-art technology aren't the only amenities this campus has to offer. It has a gym, kitchen, cafe, library, veterans services center, and lounges for students and staff.

The bottom line: up to 15,000 MSJC students seeking college credits, certificates, and degrees now have a new campus closer to home.



NEW STEM FACILITIES GENERATE EXCITEMENT

Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) will be transformed as MSJC opens two new facilities on the San Jacinto and Menifee Valley campuses.

"This project will truly have a lasting impact on our students, some of whom will be the STEM leaders of tomorrow," Roger Schultz, Ph.D., Superintendent/President, said.

The two state-of-the-art facilities, representing a combined total of \$88.9 million, were funded through the Measure AA facilities bond and matching funds from California's Prop. 51. Each facility features laboratory and multi-use, and computer-based instructional areas.

Both STEM buildings, scheduled to open for classes in 2024, are two stories, with the San Jacinto STEM measuring 56,863 square feet and Menifee's at 41,865 square feet.

PARTNERSHIPS

MIDDLE SCHOOL GIRLS VISIT MSJC TO EXPLORE STEM FIELDS

MSJC welcomed more than 400 eighth-grader girls from Banning and Beaumont middle schools to the San Jacinto Campus for an early introduction to STEM careers. The youths learned from women in the science, technology, engineering, and math fields at a STEM conference hosted by the local branch of the American Association of University Women (AAUW).

For more than two decades, AAUW San Gorgonio Pass Group of the Redlands Branch has organized this invigorating conference with MSJC to engage, influence, and motivate middle school girls to succeed in school and pursue careers in STEM fields.

STUDENTS AT MIDDLE COLLEGE HIGH SCHOOL GET A JUMP START ON COLLEGE

MSJC partnered with the San Jacinto Unified School District (SJUSD) to launch the San Jacinto Middle College High School at MSJC's San Jacinto Campus. The program is intended to provide a seamless pathway for students from high school to community college.

The middle college high school provides SJUSD high school students direct access to college-level courses and services. The courses offered through the program are English, dance, biology, and art and prepares students for associate degrees or to transfer to universities. It is the second such partnership for MSJC. Under an agreement with the Beaumont Unified School District, MSJC's San Gorgonio Pass Campus is home to the Beaumont Middle College High School.

The city of Menifee partnered with MSJC’s Environmental Studies Department to present the Electric Vehicle Car Show and Clean Air Expo at the Menifee Valley Campus.

The San Jacinto Campus hosted the first Community Resource Fair, sponsored by MSJC’s Eagles Landing, the MSJC Foundation, and the MSJC Student Health Centers, in collaboration with the San Jacinto Homeless, At-Risk, Population (HARP) outreach program. The campus hosts a variety of activities to celebrate culture, including The Source Festival, as part of the statewide Undocumented Student Week of Action, the annual Drag Show to celebrate Pride Month, and the Samahan Dance Company to celebrate Asian Pacific Islander Desi American Heritage Month.

The Temecula Valley Campus is home to a variety of activities, including the Community Christmas Dinner held by the various Rotary Clubs in Temecula, and the Local Car Scene’s Cars and Coffee event. California State University, San Marcos holds classes at the campus to provide education for those seeking a four-year degree closer to home.

MSJC’s Apprenticeship and Work-Based Learning program hosted the Apprenticeship Connection Summit at the campus as part of National Apprenticeship Week. Jessica Pitt, the Assistant Deputy Secretary of Healthcare Workforce with the California Labor & Workforce Development, served as keynote speaker.

PROGRAMS AND INNOVATION



CONTRACT AND COMMUNITY EDUCATION PARTNERSHIPS

The Contract and Community Education program develops innovative programs that are in high demand. In collaboration with the San Bernardino Community College District, Contract and Community Education secured funding to train Scott's Miracle Grow employees with valuable job skills.

Contract Education is partnering with Green Flower, a California-based leading cannabis education company, to offer three not-for-credit certificate courses. The programs focus on various aspects of the industry, with courses centered on Advanced Cultivation Technician, Advanced Manufacturing Agent, and Advanced Dispensary Associate training. Upon completion, participants gain access to Green Flower's career portal as well as the college's online job board, JobSpeaker, which allows local employers to post job openings.

Contract and community education also worked with the Temecula Wine Growers Association to secure \$180,000 in grants to upskill more than 300 winery workers.

It is efforts like these that help our region develop a strong and skilled workforce that leads to economic stability.



DIAGNOSTIC MEDICAL SONOGRAPHY PROGRAM IS UNRIVALED

MSJC's Diagnostic Medical Sonography (DMS) is one of the top DMS programs in the United States. It is also the only such program in the Inland Empire within the California Community College system.



The program is accredited by the Commission on Accreditation of Allied Health Education Programs (CAAHEP) upon the recommendation of the Joint Review Commission for Diagnostic Medical Sonography.

This coveted accolade means MSJC students who complete the program are highly sought after by employers.

MSJC LAUNCHES CALIFORNIA'S FIRST DRONE CERTIFICATE PROGRAM

The Drone Certificate program teaches students the basics of drone operations in Geospatial Information Science (GIS).

As the only program of its kind in the California Community College system, it provides MSJC students with hands-on experience in a newly remodeled GIS lab, on state-of-the-art computers, and with an expansive fleet of drones.

Demand for drone or unmanned aerial systems (UAS) pilots are rapidly popping up throughout the region and state in industries such as in construction, surveying, real estate, agriculture, law enforcement. These cutting-edge skills will launch students into versatile careers.



COME COLLABORATE AT ONE OF MSJC'S MAKERSPACES

MSJC launched a pilot program called Invention and Inclusive Innovation (i3) initiative. The eight-week workshop series focused on entrepreneurship and diversity at the college's Innovative Animatronic Makerspace at the San Jacinto Campus. It was designed to inspire students by helping them unlock new talent that transfers into the skills needed for future careers.

Students worked with their peers in small teams and received personalized coaching from a diverse group of faculty to researching real-world problems, creating products, and determining sales strategies.

The MakerSpaces at the San Jacinto and Menifee Valley campuses are collaborative and innovative spaces where individuals of all backgrounds are invited to explore, create, and bring their ideas to life. Community members are invited to use the facilities.

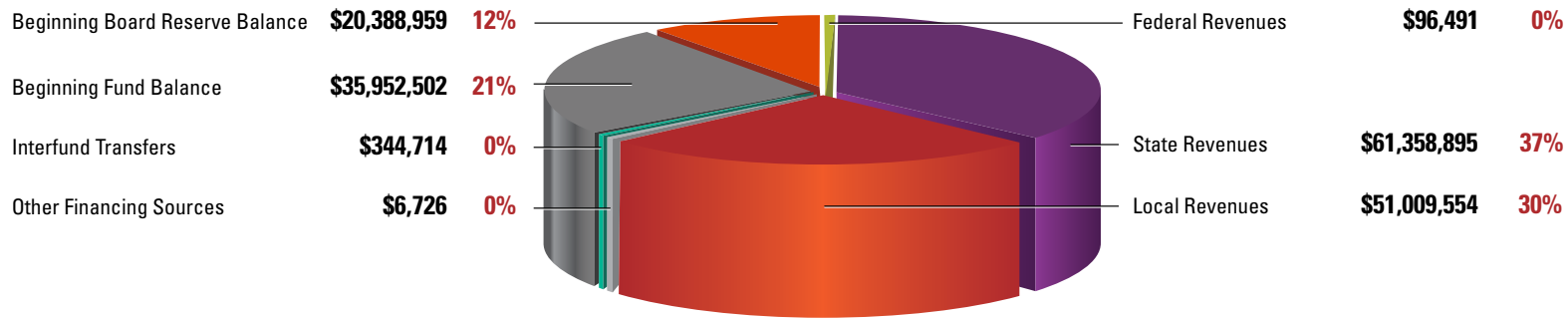




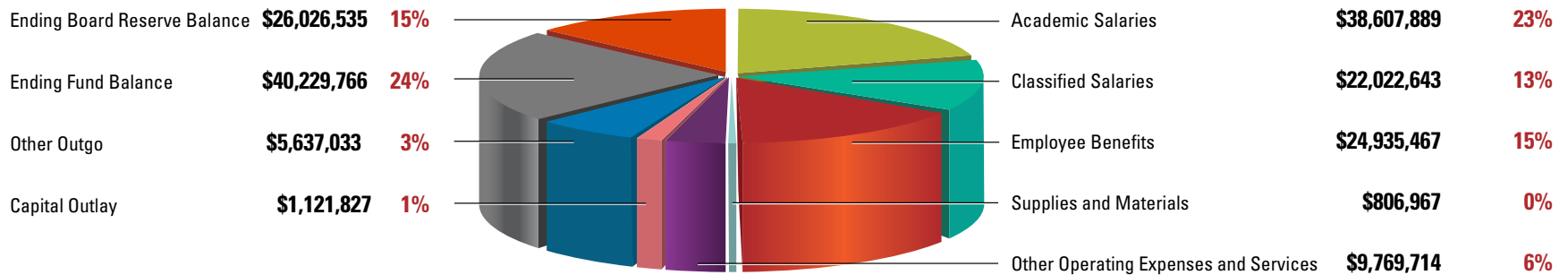

\$169,157,841

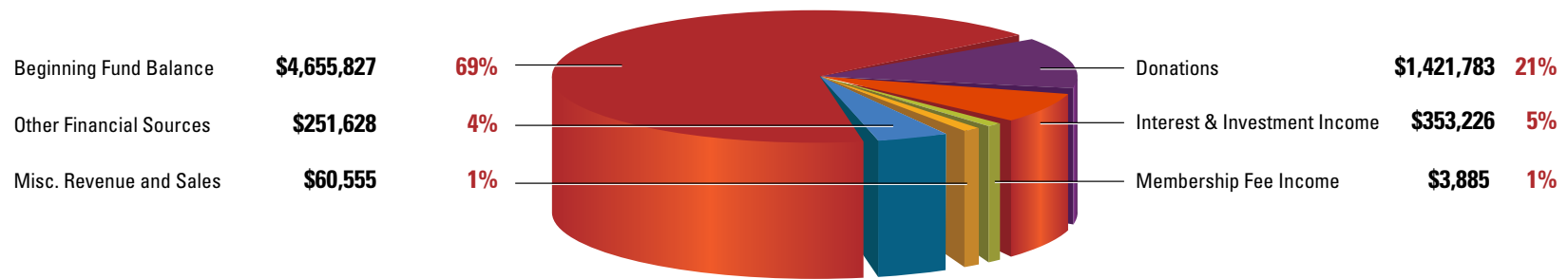


General Fund Unrestricted Expenditures and Ending Fund Balance:
\$169,157,841

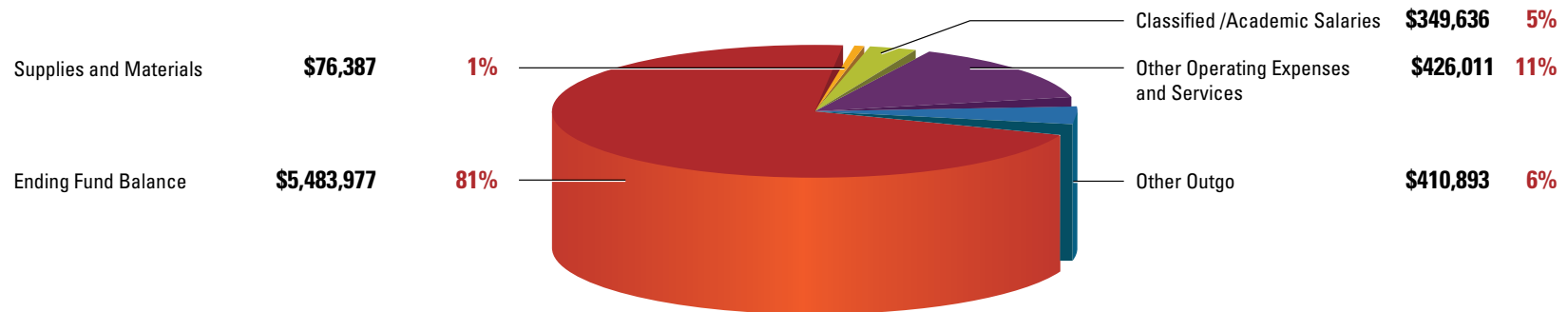
